## Introduction

Slums and Villages lack access to basic services like education, health care and several other basic facilities. Children drop out of school to lend a helping hand to parents in their work so that they can meet their basic needs. People in slums and Villages suffer from adverse health conditions due to lack of education which results in a lack of awareness regarding health and hygiene. To bring about a positive change in the lives of the underprivileged and the marginalized communities, our founder took initiative and started working in slums of Delhi with some volunteers to promote awareness regarding importance of education, healthcare and hygiene. We soon realised that health is directly connected to and impacts the socio-economic conditions of people, their education and livelihood. Towards this, education programs, non-formal tutoring and literacy drives were organized in Bhalaswa Slum and Kadipur village. After the success of these initiatives, Shikshadwar Foundation, a not-for-profit organization was formed in 2025 with a vision to bring about a positive change and bridge the need gap by providing services to underprivileged populations of our society.

Based on comprehensive needs assessments conducted across urban slums and rural communities in Delhi and other parts of India, SHIKSHADWAR FOUNDATION has identified five critical pillars that must be addressed to enable sustainable and positive transformation in the lives of vulnerable populations. These core focus areas are:

1. **Education**, to ensure access to quality learning and reduce dropout rates from schools.
2. **Skill Development and Vocational Training**, to enhance employability and income-generating capabilities.
3. **Women Empowerment and Livelihood Generation**, to strengthen financial independence and promote women-led enterprises;
4. **Health and Hygiene**, to improve community well-being through awareness, preventive care, and access to basic health practices.
5. **Environmental Sustainability and Enhancement**, to foster responsible community practices and ecological balance.

By integrating these five interconnected pillars into our program design and implementation strategy, the Foundation aims to create holistic, measurable, and long-term impact across underserved communities.

- To promote entrepreneurship and income-generation models at the grassroots level.
- To implement environment enhancement initiatives including awareness, conservation, and community-led sustainability programs.

4. **Public Health:** *Our public health initiatives focus on preventive care, health awareness, and promoting hygienic living practices to improve overall well-being and reduce vulnerability to disease.*
5. **Environment:** *To foster responsible community practices and ecological balance*

## Impact and initiatives- Program

SHIKSHADWAR FOUNDATION is committed to improving the lives of the poorest and most underprivileged communities by strengthening access to education for children and providing skill development training to women and girls to enable sustainable socio-economic development.

In line with this commitment, the Foundation has launched **Project Shiksha** in the slum area of Bhalaswa and in Kadipur village Delhi.

### *Under Project Shiksha, the following interventions are being implemented:*

#### **A) Education Support for Children:**

*The program aims to enroll and provide bridge education support to 50 out-of-school or underserved children from the community. Through a structured two-month preparatory program, children will receive foundational academic support to help them qualify for entrance or assessment tests, enabling their admission into formal schools in the upcoming academic year.*

#### **B) Skill Development for Women and Girls:**

*The Foundation will provide certified tailoring training to 50 women and girls over a period of six months. The program focuses on building practical skills aligned with market demand, followed by job placement support and linkage to income-generating opportunities to ensure sustainable livelihoods.*
